1. Set clear rules for masking

- Implement universal masking regardless of vaccination status, to comply with CDC guidance
- Add masks to school supply lists for each grade level and recommend at least five clean masks in student backpacks each week
- Provide disposable and age-appropriate masks for students who forget or lose them during the school day
- **Optional:** Define a policy for students and others who challenge masking rules

2. Create safe environments

- Modify physical spaces and operating protocols for proper ventilation and enhanced distancing
- Develop, implement, and communicate protocols for using and cleaning shared spaces/materials, including sanitizing high-touch surfaces, using portable handwashing stations and eating outdoors
- Put cleaning protocols in place (e.g. sanitizing high-touch surfaces)
- **Optional:** Re-configure HVAC settings and install filters for optimal filtered airflow

3. Enable everyday COVID-19 health screening

- Train staff to identify potential COVID-19 symptoms
- Develop a healthy screening checklist (fever, travel, exposure, etc.)
- Decide who will administer the checklist (school or parents) and when
- Identify a provider to direct students and staff for symptomatic and asymptomatic testing
- **Optional:** Partner with a symptom monitoring solution vendor (app or website)
- **Optional:** Set up an on-site testing and screening operation

4. Set clear guidance for COVID-19 test results

- Develop testing protocol for symptomatic and exposed students and staff
- Set clear criteria for circumstances that require notification/communication
- Identify close contacts that require quarantine/isolation in concert with your public health department in the event of a positive case
- Determine who will be notified (e.g., classmates of a student who tests positive, everyone in the school) and who is responsible for initiating communication (e.g., principal, nurse)
- Set the actions that will be taken including communication and other health and safety measures (e.g. testing, shift to virtual/outdoor learning, etc.)

5. Encourage vaccines for eligible students and staff

- Encourage and educate faculty, staff, and students on the safety and efficacy of COVID-19 vaccines
- Follow the latest news and guidance on vaccine safety and availability for students 11 and under, as it becomes available
- **Optional:** Hold back-to-school community pop-up vaccine clinics with pharmacy or health partner for students ages 12 and over, and their families
